Streaming offers a simpler, more affordable, and more flexible way to watch TV. But for many members of Southeastern Indiana REMC, the idea of switching from cable or satellite to streaming still feels overwhelming.

“We know people are curious about streaming, but they have a lot of questions,” said B.J. Myers, spokesperson for Southeastern Indiana REMC. “They’re unsure about what equipment they need, how they’ll access local channels, and whether they’ll be able to find the shows they love. That’s where we come in.”

To help ease the transition and answer common questions, Southeastern Indiana REMC is hosting a **free Streaming 101 class on Tuesday, Aug. 5 at 6 p.m. in the Community Room at the REMC headquarters in Osgood.** The class will walk members step-by-step through what streaming is, how it works, what internet speeds are needed and how to select the right services and devices for their household.

Attendees will also learn about MyBundle, a free online tool that helps users build a custom streaming lineup based on their favorite channels and content.

All participants will receive a free Roku device, allowing them to get started immediately without investing in additional equipment.

The class is limited to the first 100 RSVPs. If demand exceeds capacity, a second session will be offered on Tuesday, Aug. 19 at 6 p.m.

“Many people are still paying for expensive TV services because switching seems complicated,” said Myers. “But once they understand how it works—and how much they can save—they realize it’s not only doable, it’s empowering.”
