## TECH TIPS FOR THE HOLIDAYS AND BEYOND

- **Set up a guest network.** When friends or family visit — or when you plug in new devices — it's smart to give them access without giving them access to your smart-locks, cameras or personal devices.
- **Update firmware & hardware.** Many smart-devices and routers push updates that fix security vulnerabilities. Before your network is in full holiday use, check for updates and reboot your router if needed.
- **Optimize Wi-Fi coverage.** Ensure your router is placed centrally and out in the open; if you have a large home or many streaming devices, consider adding a Wi-Fi extender or mesh system.
